

EVALUATION DEFINITIONS & TERMS

Evaluation Definitions

Activities: Activities that an organization proposes to conduct to achieve its program or project goals (e.g., build parks, organize soccer practices for youth, train mentors, hold community meetings).

Outputs: Immediate-term results associated with a program or project (e.g., number of children who participated in a program, number of people trained).

Outcomes: Short-term and medium-term benefits or changes for participants after participating in a program (e.g., percent of kids who increased their life skills after participating in a program, percent of kids who lost weight after participating in a program).

Impact: Long-term change produced by a program on a large population of participants (e.g., reduced obesity rates in a city or higher graduation rates in a neighborhood).

Performance Measures: Outputs and outcomes a grantee reports on at the end of the grant cycle.
